

Job Opening for a Scientific Collaborator/Junior Researcher Position Salary Scheme TVL 13

Commencing on 1 October 2014 the Westphalian Wilhelms **University of Münster** seeks to fill one or two position(s) of **scientific collaborator/junior researcher** at the **Institute of Missiology and the Study of Theologies Beyond Europe**, within the Catholic-Theological Faculty.

The positions are non-tenure, either part-time or full-time, with a 50% (19 hours 55 minutes) or 100% (39 hours 50 minutes) of the regular work load hours schedule.

The positions are limited to two years.

Tasks of the appointee include:

Development and coordination of an international Erasmus Plus application for a **Joint Masters Degree program »Intercultural Theology and Interreligious Studies«**; or/and coordination work for and research collaboration within the Marie Curie research project **»Translating God(s): Comparative Theology in Europe«**;

pursuit of his/her own interdisciplinary research project within one of the institute's main research areas:

- Missiology and Mission History
 - World Christianity and Non-Western Theologies
 - Interreligious Studies and Comparative Theology;
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- collaboration in the Institute's production of publications;
 - teaching workload: 2 hrs per week (usually one course) per semester.

Requirements

- Completed postgraduate studies, with a degree in either Theology, Religious Studies, or in other relevant areas of cultural-historical studies and social sciences;
- preferably with a PhD or ThD completed;
- experience in the development and coordination of international teaching or research projects;
- language skills, including relevant classical or modern research languages;
- IT technology and computer skills;
- good team work and communication skills.

The WWU Münster is committed to particularly welcome more applications of female postgraduates and academics.

In case of equal suitability, competence and academic achievements, female applicants will be given preferred consideration, unless reasons of distinct credentials and personal profile are in favour of a male applicant.

In case of equal qualification applicants with disability will also receive preferred consideration for hire.
